## Church Funds

The Loma Linda University Church is blessed to have many members and friends who are faithful in their giving. That is greatly appreciated. I suspect, however, that many don't realize exactly what happens when they give. Let me briefly explain some key points.

In the Seventh-day Adventist Church, churches belong to a sisterhood of churches called (at the local level) *conferences*. It is from the local conference office that pastors are paid, not from the local church. In this system, tithe money given at a local church is forwarded from that church to the conference office and is there put to use in several different ways, one of which is paying pastors' salaries throughout that local conference. In this way, churches that otherwise could not afford to have pastoral leadership are able to do so. (In the future, we will discuss the full use of tithe dollars).

It is vital, however, to remember that for a local church, funding for its ministries, upkeep, and budget *does not come from tithe dollars*. Tithe funds, in their entirety, are forwarded on to the local conference. For that reason, it is of great importance to the functioning of the local congregation to *remember our church in your giving!*

As you may (or may not) be aware, funding for the local ministries of our church comes almost exclusively from funds that are raised by the individual ministries themselves. This means, for example, that the ministry leaders of Youth 202 or Moms' Network or Young Adult Ministries or Media Ministries or most any other ministry of the church must spend a significant amount of time and energy in raising the funding for the ministry they wish to provide to the church at large and the community around us.

In addition to ministry funding, the church budget also stands in need. In brief, the other key items in the church budget deal with the maintenance of the facility, utilities, and salaries for locally hired personnel (e.g., maintenance, music staff, support staff, etc.), and minimal funding for ministries.

As a result of this, may I urge you not to forget the local church and its ministries as you plan your giving? We are thankful for your support and grateful to God for his provision.

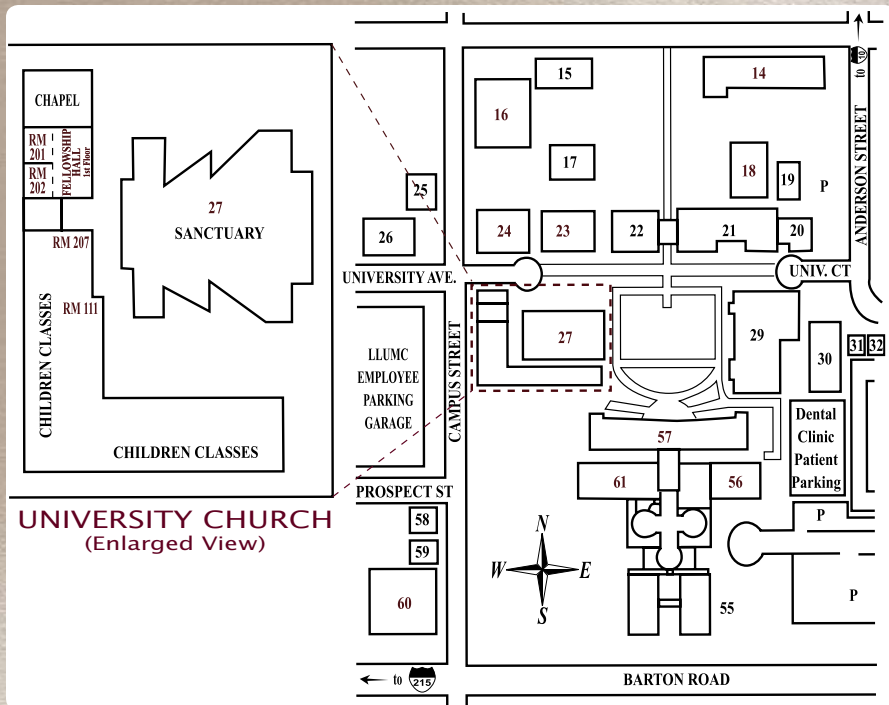
