Healthy Trust in God

Once a year, thanks to the continuing generosity of the University Church, Loma Linda University devotes a special Sabbath to consider our ministry of education in the unique setting of our health sciences university. This Sabbath we contemplate and celebrate the relationship between spiritual and physical well-being. The sermon today will be delivered by Allan Handysides, Director of the Health Ministries Department of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. He is a physician, an ordained minister, and church leader with extensive experience throughout the world, including years as medical missionary in Africa.

Adventists have accepted the task of helping the world understand the practical relationship between faith and health. We know that there is no more effective factor for human health than profound trust in our Creator. Faith affects every dimension of our being, including our health, because we were created to be in a trusting relationship with God. The wise man of Scripture's Proverbs writes poetically:

“Do not be wise in your own eyes;
fear the LORD, and turn away from evil.
It will be healing for your flesh
and refreshment for your body.”¹

The visionary founder of our health ministry in Loma Linda, Ellen White wrote: “The assurance of God’s approval will promote physical health. It fortifies the soul against doubt, perplexity, and excessive grief that so often sap the vital forces and induce nervous diseases.”² Thus the good news of God’s grace, expressed to us in Jesus Christ, is a potent force for the health of whole persons. It is our privilege to share this practical message with the world.

Students who come to our University from over 90 different countries find an opportunity on our campus to combine faith with scholarship. It is an integral part of the ministry of the University Church to help prepare these students for their lives of service. And we sincerely hope that the result will be greater capacity to provide service for the sake of human wholeness now, and for eternity. On behalf of Loma Linda University, I want to express thanks to the University Church for the invitation to collaborate in today’s special services. May our Creator, who awakens our desire serve others, bless our worship this Sabbath.

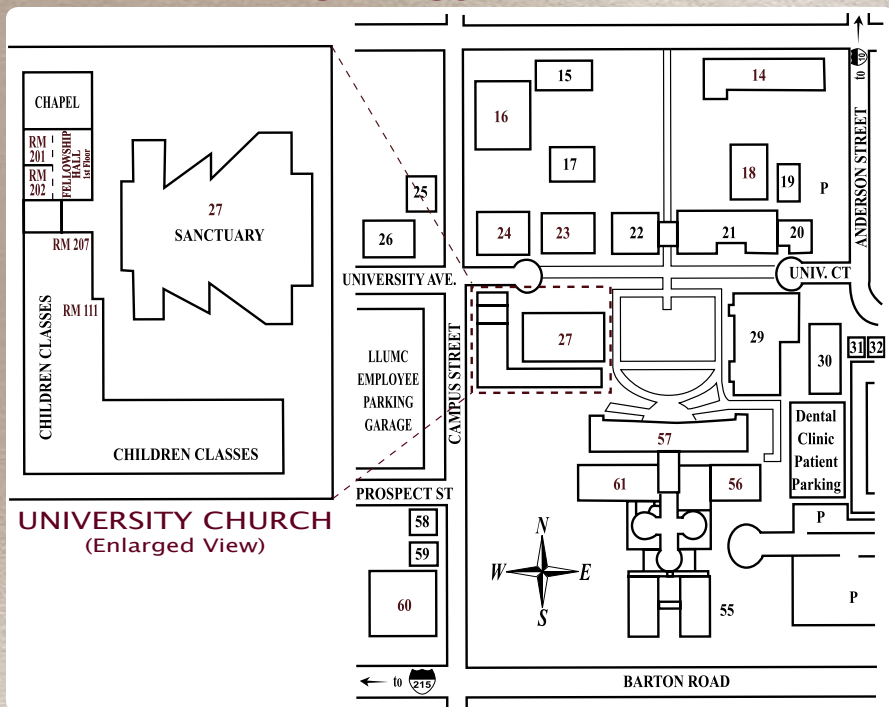
