Conflict is a reality of life. The best of marriages and families deal with it. At the same time, despite the fact that it is here to stay, how we handle conflict determines a great deal regarding how healthy our marriages and families will be. Many relationships have multiple strengths in their favor and yet, due to an inability to deal well with conflict, are mired in the mud of mediocrity.

Today we continue our sermon series entitled, "Family: Living With the People We Can't Live Without." As we do so, we address conflict. What does the Bible have to say about conflict? Does it even address the issue? If it does, is what it recommends still relevant in a world two thousand years removed from its time?

If your marriage and/or family is struggling with conflict, I hope that by the time the worship service ends today, you will have a sense of hope that there is a better way.

Let me suggest a couple of books you might find helpful when it comes to conflict. *The Family: A Christian Perspective on the Contemporary Home* by Jack and Judith Balswick has sections that are helpful for sorting through conflict. Another very good book is one I mentioned last week entitled *A Lasting Promise: A Christian Guide to Fighting for Your Marriage* by Scott Stanley, Daniel Trathen, Savanna McCain, and Milt Bryan. It devotes quite a bit of space to understanding, dealing with and resolving conflict. In fact, I'm not sure I've read anything better in understanding marital conflict.

Don't forget this afternoon's seminar (3:30 – 5 p.m.) entitled "Perspectives on Conflict" by Dr. Curtis Fox, in the Campus Chapel. Dr. Fox teaches in the Marriage and Family Therapy program at Loma Linda University. This seminar will place more tools in your hands for dealing with conflict in your marriage and family.

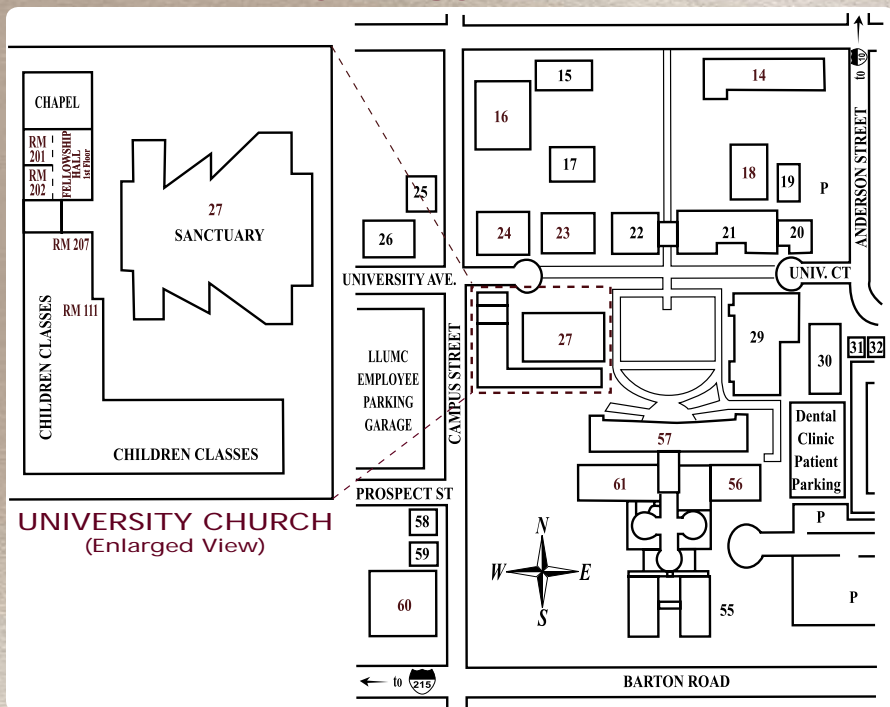
