The Sermon on the Mount

As we focus on Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount, I continue to be struck by the exceedingly high ideal to which he calls us. Week by week, I come face to face with just how far short of God's ideal I fall. The Sermon on the Mount makes that painfully clear. And yet, strangely, I am driven to continue to mine the sermon for its depths. Why? Maybe the simple reason is well-stated by Ellen White in the book, *Christ's Object Lessons*: "All his bid-dings are enablings" (p. 333). Translated? *If he calls us to it, he'll empower us to do it.* So the Sermon on the Mount is not only the statement of the high standard of God; it also inherently contains the promise that he will empower us to continue to grow in this way.

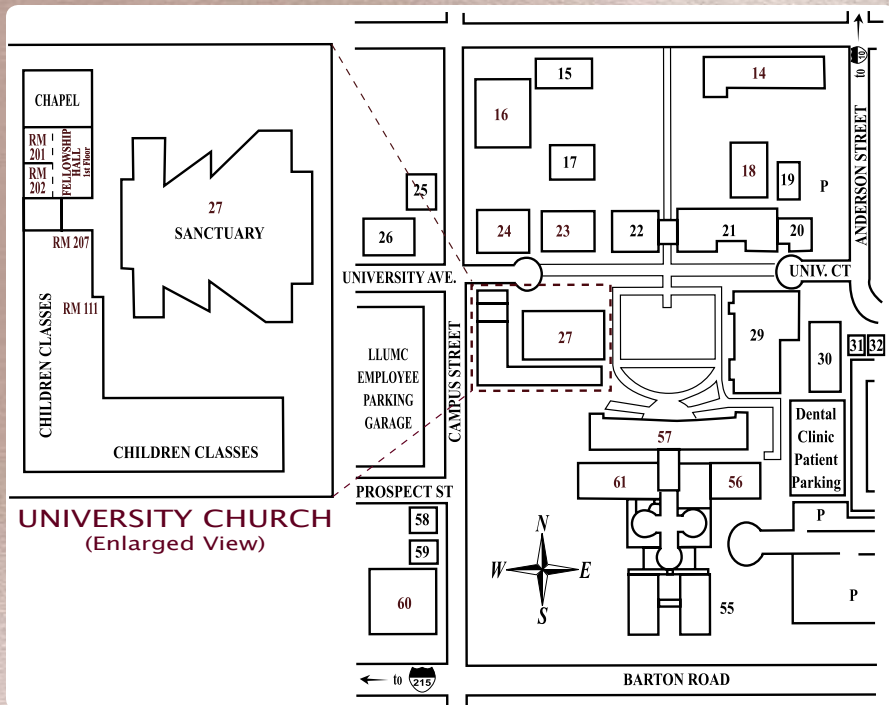
