Morrie Schwartz was dying. The professor of social psychology could have given himself up to self-pity. He could have become bitter and withdrawn. But he had a different idea. He saw dying as a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. It would become the basis for one last writing project—one last chance to change the world.

Morrie re-connected with his favorite student, the renowned sportswriter Mitch Albom. Albom was at the other end of life's journey. He lived for money, fast cars, and a blur of "important" activity. Then his newspaper went on strike, and for months he visited his favorite professor, and drank in wisdom from the other end of life. His Tuesdays with Morrie changed him forever.

In the Baccalaureate sermon this morning, we will reflect on four major life lessons that Morrie taught Mitch. And we will apply the unique Loma Linda difference to Morrie's lessons for life. The Loma Linda perspective means you don't have to wait until you're dying to learn how to live.

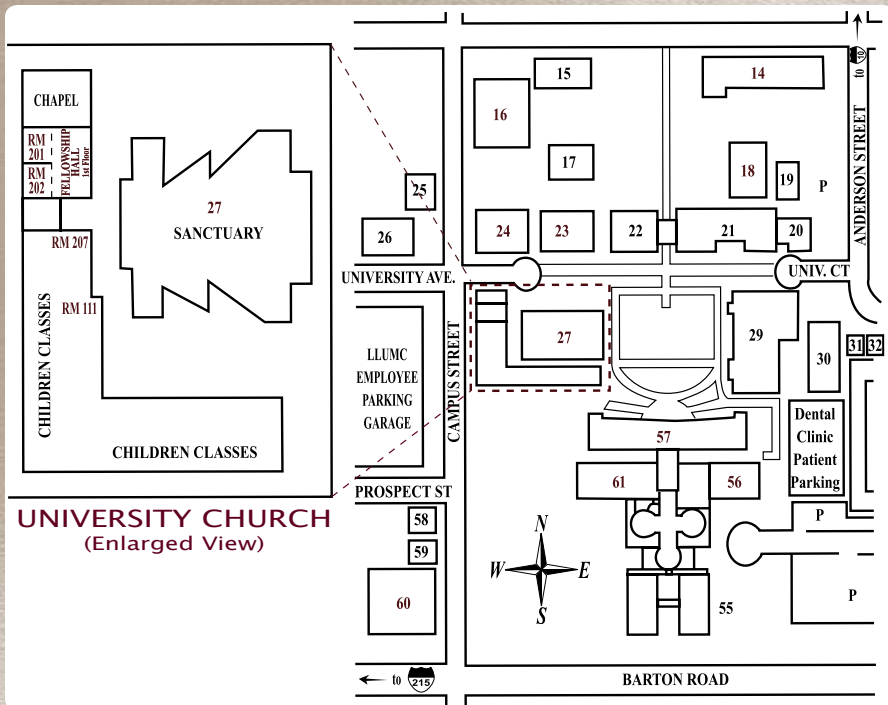

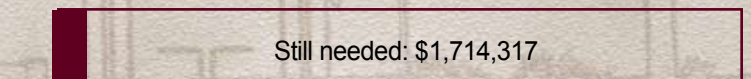
